<b>STEERING GROUP MEMBER</b>	<p><b>Role:</b> Ensure strategic alignment with the current needs of the sector. The group will be set the scope for the update, sign off the structure proposed by the working group and ensure key considerations are addressed by the working groups.</p> <p>The Steering Group will not be actively involved in the review or update to the specific scheme material.</p> <p><b>Commitment:</b> Active involvement in up to four meetings between May and December 2017.</p>
<b>WORKING GROUP: INDUSTRY LEAD</b>	<p><b>Role:</b> As an Industry Lead, you will take a hands on role in the development of the course material; defining, reviewing and updating course content; providing technical expertise and experience as required.</p> <p>The Industry Lead will remain an active contributor to a ‘Core’ Working Group, as well as the chair of a scheme Working Group. This is an essential and important role within the scheme update and provides an excellent opportunity to shape the scheme.</p> <p><b>Commitment:</b> Active involvement in up to five meetings between May and December 2017, with additional work in between workshops up to a maximum of five days.</p>
<b>SCHEME WORKING GROUP MEMBER</b>	<p><b>Role:</b> You will take a hands on role in the development of the <u>additional modules</u> for one scheme; defining, reviewing and updating course content; providing technical expertise and experience as required.</p> <p><b>Commitment:</b> Attend up to five workshops between May and December 2017, with additional work in between workshops up to a maximum of five days.</p>
