Latest Higher Education statistics highlight need to drive diversity in our sector

The latest Higher Education Statistics Authority (HESA) report shows that less than one percent of HE leavers joined the energy and utilities sector. 80% of these students were white, 37% were female and five percent were non-UK students. Find out more in our HESA infographic.

Utilities sector shows strong position in latest Manpower survey

Hiring activity in the utilities sector stands at +12% according to the latest employment outlook by Manpower group. The outlook also found that despite English employers reporting the highest confidence in 18 months, the overall UK hiring outlook is the worst since 2012 due to declines particularly in Wales and Northern Ireland.

Policy Updates

Impact of International Students in the UK

A recent report by the MAC has found that more than 750,000 students come to the UK each year to study, of which the majority study business or engineering and technology. It also found that 31% of students moving from a Tier 4 student visa into a Tier 2 work visa move into a STEM related job. Read more [here](#).

English Apprenticeship starts in June 2018 57% higher than previous year

The number of English apprenticeship starts for June 2018 are 57% higher than June 2017, but 40% lower than June 2016 according to the Education and Skills Funding Agency. So far, 22,300 starts have been recorded in June 2018, compared to 37,000 two years ago. Read more [here](#).
