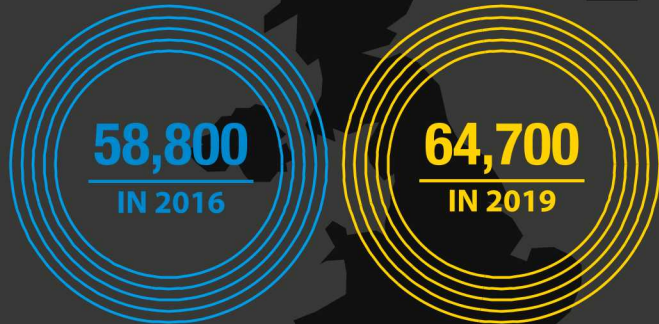
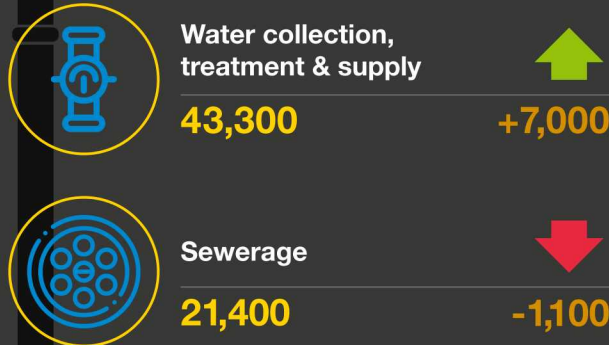

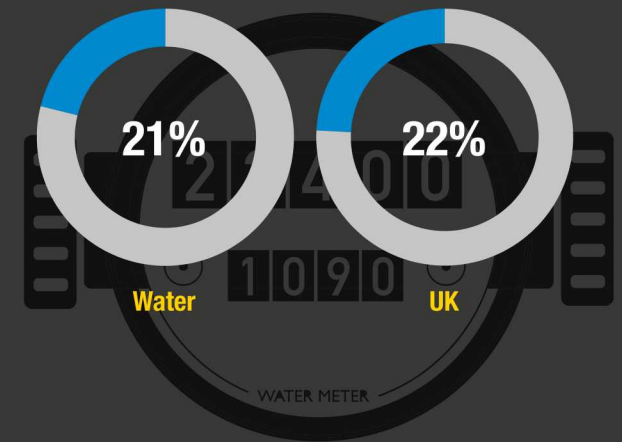

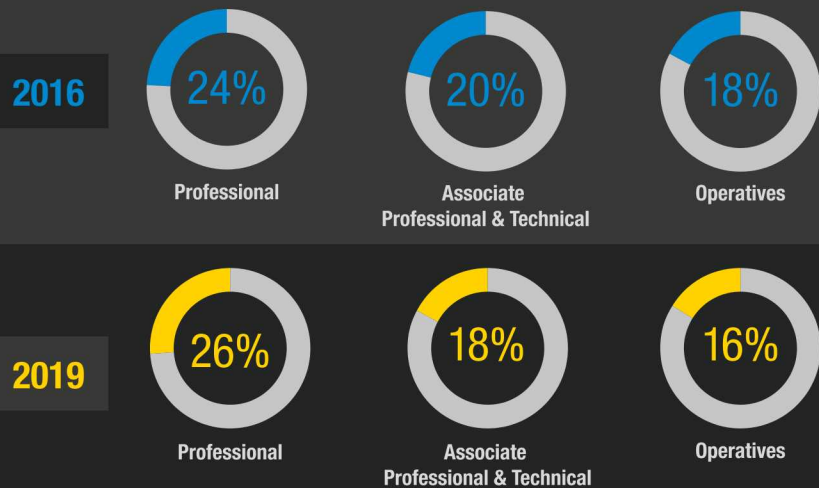

Top three occupational groups



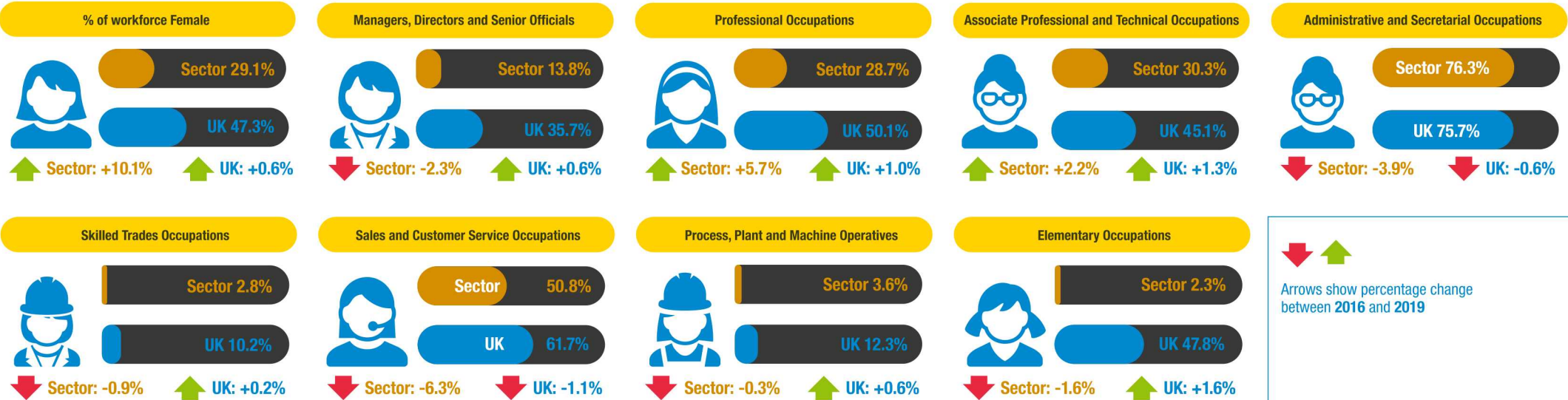
Forecast number of vacancies 2020-2029

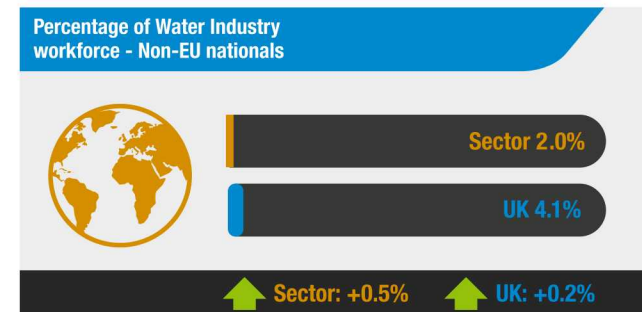
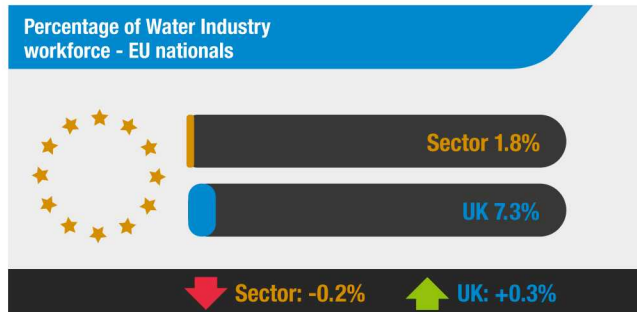
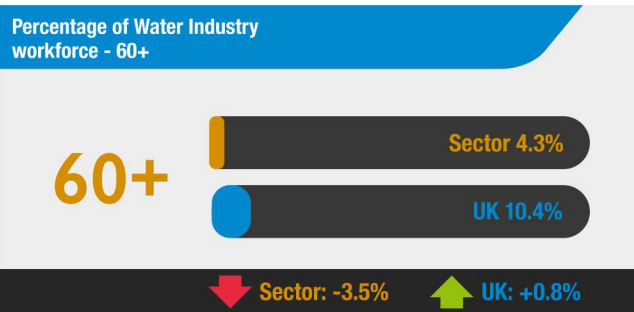
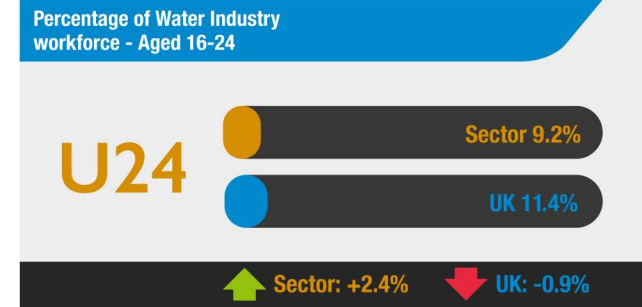
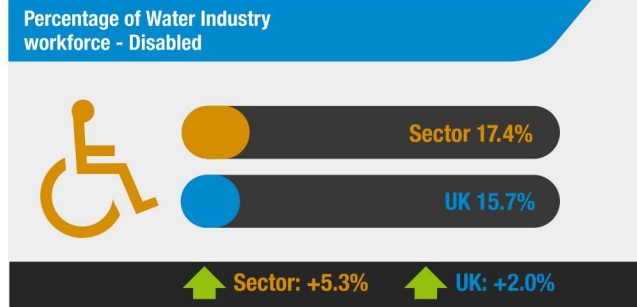
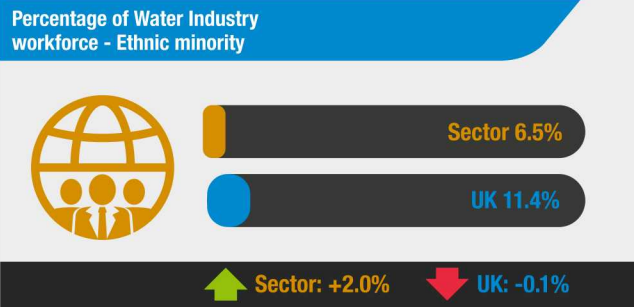
